Jesus Christ Notes: A far-reaching documentary that explores Elvis Presley's epic culinary journey. Interviews with former cooks, family members, friends, weirdos, and archived interviews with the man himself bring the story to life with vibrancy and depth.

The relevance of Presley's childhood and youth are thoroughly explored. We even learn that Elvis quit the school football team because he was hungry.

Featured recipes include "Fried Squirrel" and, of course, "Pig's Feet and Turnip Greens".

There's nice music in the background, as there would have been throughout Presley's life, but the emphasis here is on food and its constant relevance to The King's personal evolution.

One of the great achievements of this film is its vivid portrayal of the unsettling freaks that surrounded Elvis. It's a good job there's no truth in the saying that "you are the company you keep".

Warning: there are brief scenes of hunting (including the skinning of a squirrel) near the beginning of the story.
