Notes:

Having been somewhat surprised at hearing what I consider a defect in the sound of the original broadcast, I have now sort of determined that it is probably an artefact of one of the percussion instruments together with the AAC compression that is being heard as a high frequency noise or sibilance on this excellent recording of an excellent show (probably from a cymbal of some sort). This is an intermittent sound (obviously linked to when the instrument is used in any given song) that, IMO, really detracts from the music.

Having been 'poked' to share my 'cleaned up' version, I've decided to risk life & limb (LOL) by doing just that .. so here goes .. 'O nice folks at Dime please be kind ;-D

Details of what I did to it during remastering (using Audition & Wavelab6):

- Apply several notch filters in the frequency range 11984Hz to 13602Hz to reduce 'the noise'

- removed several noise 'clicks/glitches' and fixed several clipping points

- Limiting (-0.2dB max)(the original has a odd ceiling)

- WAV edited to fit on to 2xCDRs (with overlap) plus fades in/out.

- Track split positions (slightly adjusted where necessary)

Please note that this remastering has been done to modify the original master recording with the aim of enhancing the listening experience. If you did not notice any problem with the original versions of this show then you really do not need to download this one. If however like me you found the intermittent high pitched metallic hiss distracting & spoiling an otherwise superb recording then I heartily recommend this version.
